#### ORDER

It appearing that the United States Attorney's Office has submitted a proposed Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule, including a Valuation Table, for certain petty offenses pertaining to the United States Forest Service (USFS) and the National Forest System (NFS), in the Western District of Michigan,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that any prior Orders regarding forfeiture of collateral schedules for the USFS and/or the NFS in the Western District of Michigan are hereby vacated upon the effective date of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Rule 58(d) of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure and Local Criminal Rule 58.2(a), persons charged with committing an offense listed in the attached Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule may, in lieu of appearance before a United States Magistrate Judge, post and forfeit collateral in accordance with this Order and the USFS/NFS Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule and corresponding Valuation Table.

#### IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

(a) Where the USFS/NFS Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule provides a collateral amount, the officer issuing a Violation Notice must write that amount in the box at the lower right on the Violation Notice, unless the officer determines that the circumstances are aggravated, in which event the officer

may fix the offense as a Mandatory Appearance offense, requiring the offender's appearance before a United States Magistrate Judge.

- (b) Where the issuing officer fixed an amount to be forfeited in accordance with the USFS/NFS Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule, the offender may, with the concurrence of the United States Attorney's Office, post and consent to forfeiture of a lesser collateral amount, if the lesser amount is approved by the United States Attorney's Office.
- (c) Where the issuing officer fixed an offense as a Mandatory Appearance offense, the offender may, with the concurrence of the United States Attorney's Office for the Western District of Michigan, post and forfeit collateral in lieu of appearance before a United States Magistrate Judge, in an amount not to exceed the maximum fine under the law, if the collateral amount is approved by the United States Attorney's Office.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the attached USFS/NFS Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule, including the Valuation Table, is adopted and approved.

# FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL SCHEDULE U.S. FOREST SERVICE AND NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM

Forfeiture of collateral in lieu of appearance will be in accordance with the following procedures:

LCrR 58.2 - Forfeiture of Collateral in Lieu of Appearance in Accordance with Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(1)

## LCrR 58.2 Petty offenses and collateral forfeitures

- (a) Posting collateral in lieu of appearance A person who is charged with a violation of a Federal Wildlife Act, parking regulations governing the Federal Building, National Forest Offenses, Conduct on Postal Service Property, Violation of Law on Military Property or any other petty offense as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 1(3), may, in lieu of appearance, post collateral in the amount indicated for the offense, waive appearance before a United States Magistrate Judge, and consent to the forfeiture of collateral to the United States. The posting of said collateral shall signify that the offender does not contest the charge or request a hearing before the designated United States Magistrate Judge. If the collateral is forfeited, such action shall be tantamount to a finding of guilty. Collateral will be permitted only for those offenses specifically authorized by the Court in separate orders. There shall be maintained in the office of the Clerk and with each United States Magistrate Judge a current list of the petty offenses and collateral applicable thereto which the Court has established as collateral forfeiture offenses.
- (b) Failure to post and forfeit collateral If a person charged with an offense under this rule fails to post and forfeit collateral, any punishment, including fine, imprisonment or probation, may be imposed within the limits established by law upon conviction or after trial.
- (c) <u>Aggravated offenses</u> If, within the discretion of the law enforcement officer, the offense is of an aggravated nature, the law enforcement officer may require appearance, and any punishment including fine, imprisonment or probation, may be imposed within the limits established by law upon conviction or after trial.
- (d) Appearance required Nothing contained in this rule shall prohibit law enforcement officers from arresting a person for the commission of any offense, including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited, and requiring the person charged to appear before a United States Magistrate Judge or, upon arrest, taking the person immediately before a United States Magistrate Judge.

## SCHEDULE OF FINES FOR OFFENSES COMMITTED WITHIN A NATIONAL FOREST

<u>Organizations</u> Due to the increased liability and potential for severe environmental degradation posted by commercial and organized activities, the collateral amounts for violations listed herein committed by an organization shall be doubled. Organization includes a corporation, government or government agency, business, trust, estate, partnership, association, church, club, hunting club, or any other legal entity where two or more persons have a joint or common interest.

Natural Resource Valuation Table Where "+" is noted after the collateral amount, values shall be assessed on a per capita basis, i.e., the collateral amount is calculated based on the number of fish, wildlife, plant or tree species, or other natural resource item impacted, possessed, transported, killed, etc., in violation of applicable state or federal law. Refer to the valuation table to calculate collateral amounts. In cases where the per capita valuation exceeds \$2,500, officers should require defendant's mandatory appearance ("MA") at Court.
