This matter comes before the Court on the application for admission (the “Application”) and supporting documentation thereof filed by Alexander J. Berry-Santoro (P41099). In his Application, Attorney Berry-Santoro requests that the Court allow him admission to practice law in this District. See W.D. Mich. LGenR 2.1(a). Chief Judge Robert J. Jonker assigned this matter to the undersigned three-judge panel (the “Panel”) for hearing and decision. See Administrative Order No. 19-AD-078.

The Court conducted a hearing on October 10, 2019, at which Attorney Berry-Santoro appeared. Having considered Attorney Berry-Santoro’s written and oral submissions, the Court entered an Order conditionally granting the Application. See Administrative Order 19-AD-087.

In accordance with Administrative Order 19-AD-087, Attorney Berry-Santoro timely filed an Affidavit of Declarant Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746 declaring under penalty of perjury that he has satisfied all conditions of the Court’s Administrative Order. The panel has reviewed the Administrative Order and the Affidavit of Declarant Pursuant to 28 USC § 1746 and has concluded that Attorney Berry-Santoro has complied with the Administrative Order and shall be admitted to practice law in this District.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Alexander J. Berry-Santoro shall be admitted to practice law in this District, effective upon entry of this Order.
