- be a member in good standing of this Court's bar,
- have appeared as counsel of record or served as a facilitative mediator in at least five (5) cases over the past (5) years in this Court or another federal court,
- have completed a minimum of 16 hours of training sponsored or approved by the Court,
- agree to serve in a *pro bono* capacity once each year. Additional requests by the Court for pro bono service in a calendar year may be declined.
